

Care and Maintenance of Timber Floor

To keep a Cork floor looking its best, it must be kept clean and well maintained.

- **Day to Day Maintenance**

Sweep the floor with an Electro-static dry mop or broom with soft bristles when required to remove grit and large particles which can potentially scratch and cause wear to the polished surface.

We would advise on the use of mats placed at entrances and adhesive felt protectors to be placed on surfaces of all movable furniture items which come in direct contact with the polished flooring.

- **When the Floor Is Dirty**

When you wash the floor, use a small amount of methylated spirits or white vinegar in the water.

We strongly suggest that you use a separate mop for these areas and not the same mop you use with detergents and/or disinfectants for other floors.

Please note that steam mops are not recommended for cleaning timber flooring.

- **When the Floor Appears 'Tired'**

When your floor starts to lose its lustre, you will need to rejuvenate the coated surface. This can be done by an application of one coat of polyurethane (an approved single pack or solvent-based). Generally, this process is performed every five to eight years.
